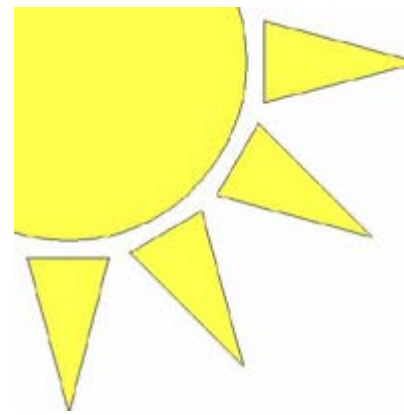

20. I Am Moving, I Am Learning

Wednesday-Friday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm (Credit available)

Chippewa Falls Middle School (Note different location)

Presenters: West Virginia University Training Team

I Am Moving, I Am Learning is a comprehensive training opportunity designed to prevent and reverse childhood obesity and promote lifelong fitness for young children through increased, intentional moderate and vigorous activity and sound nutrition. This approach was developed by Dr. Linda Carson, and her colleagues from West Virginia University under a National Center for Disease Control grant. The website at www.choosykids.com provides comprehensive information about this very successful approach along with information about the five national trainers. (Registration is limited to 125 participants with priority given to teams of 4-5 individuals from a district, program or child care provider.) Registration cost for each team is \$800.

Professional Development Plan (PDP) Integration Opportunity

Participants are invited to meet during the week with two of DPI's Early Childhood Professional Development Plan Reviewers (Mary Joslin and Barbara Wehman). They will provide support for integrating the institute's learning activities into a participant's current professional development planning process.

From the **West/North**, take Hwy 29 through downtown Chippewa Falls. After crossing the Chippewa River Bridge on Hwy 29, take the immediate exit (ramp) for County Rd J. Turn left onto E Park Ave/County Rd J. Proceed on County Rd J 1.8 miles. Turn left at the first driveway into the Northern Center complex. Park in the second parking lot and enter the building from the front. Go in the door on the right. Main Office is room 111.

From the **East/South** (driving on Hwy 29), turn right onto Seymour Cray Sr Blvd, and proceed 1.5 miles. Turn right onto County Rd J/East Park Ave. Turn left at the first driveway into the Northern Center complex. Park in the second parking lot (at the front of the building) and enter the building from the front. Go in the door on the right. Main Office is room 111.

Directions to Chippewa Falls Middle School:

Hwy 29E to Exit 72 (90th Street/Business Hwy 29/Cty Hwy X). Turn left at stop sign onto 90th/29/X. Follow old Hwy 29/X to painted wall (immediately after the railroad bridge). Turn left at painted wall (Wagner Street). Turn left at top of hill onto Mansir Street. Travel 4+ blocks on Mansir to Coleman Street. Turn left on Coleman (you will see Chippewa High School's back parking lot/gym entrance and a big red cardinal on the top of the school). To get to the Middle School, turn right off Terrill Street onto Bel Aire Boulevard (you will see the Middle School approx 2 blocks to the west).

15. Proportion Distortion

16. Inclusive Practices

Thursday-Friday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm (Credit Available)

Presenter: Jude Teicher, Independent Education Consultant

This course is designed to provide an introduction and overview to best practices for creating inclusive settings for young children and their families, and for building partnerships with school and community resources. It will help early childhood professionals develop the knowledge, skills, and dispositions required to meet the needs of all children, with a specific focus on children with differing abilities.

17. Nonviolent Crisis Intervention: Techniques for Young Children

Thursday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm (Certification will be provided)

Presenter: Ron Walsh, District Administrator, Elk Mound School District and Certified Trainer, Crisis Prevention Institute

This training is designed to assist participants in developing techniques to deal safely with challenging behaviors of children and to de-escalate a crisis. The course offers nonverbal, verbal, and physical methods that research has proven to be most effective in all settings. Participants will receive certification for one year.

18. Ages and Stages - Developmental Screening in Child Care

Thursday, 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm

Presenter: Mary Joslin, EC Program Support, CESA 10

This session is for family and group child care providers who would like to be trained to give a simple, inexpensive screening as a free service to the families serves. The Ages and Stages Questionnaire and the Ages and Stages Social Emotional are two easy-to-use tools that can be borrowed from your Resource and Referral Agency and have parents complete. They are easy to score and can assist you in discussing concerns among staff and parents.

19. Social-Emotional Screening for Birth to Three

Friday, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm

Presenter: Mary Joslin, EC Program Support, CESA 10

This half day session will look at the Greenspan Social-Emotional Growth Chart: A Screening Questionnaire For Infants and Young Children; AS:SE (Ages and Stages Social Emotional); ITSEA (Infant Toddler Social Emotional Assessment); and the BITSEA (Brief Infant Toddler Social Emotional Assessment). You will look closely at the tools, complete a protocol, explore how the tools can be used, and what resources to use when concerns are identified.

A comprehensive, collaborative, and cost-effective approach for supporting young children is the way things occur here in western Wisconsin. The Western Region Collaborating Partners workgroup has nurtured a culture of effective professional development opportunities among numerous service providers. These service providers also share resources, provide support among programs, and break down barriers to services to assure that the young child's developmental needs are at the center of their efforts. This Second Annual Western Wisconsin Early Childhood Summer Institute is just one example of this ongoing commitment to effective collaboration.

Sectional Descriptions

1. Social Emotional Development in Young Children

Monday-Tuesday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm (Credit Available)

Presenters: Julie Betchkal and Bev Haverly, Early Childhood Specialists, CESA 11

This workshop assists adults in developing intentional teaching strategies to promote social emotional development in young children. Using a pyramid model of intervention, adults will learn to lay the foundation of support necessary to prevent challenging behavior in most young children.

2. Nine Essential Skills for the Love and Logic Classroom

Monday-Tuesday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm (Credit Available)

Presenter: Loyce Shief, Education Coordinator, CESA 11 Head Start

Love and Logic is a way of working with children that puts parents and teachers back in control and teaches children to be responsible. Classroom techniques and effective strategies will be shared. Many Head Start programs, along with elementary schools, are using this approach with great success. There is an additional \$12 workbook fee for this sectional.

3. Using Environmental Rating Scales To Evaluate Your Program

Monday, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm

Presenter: Dotty Lillo, Director and Renee Ernsting, Co-Director, Childcare Resource and Referral

This presentation will introduce participants to a comprehensive tool to use when assessing their early learning programs. You will learn that environmental rating scales look at much more than just the environment. Through this scale you can assess the materials and activities offered to the children, the supervision and interactions that occur in the classroom, and much more!

4. Sensory Integration

Monday, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm

Presenter: Rhonda Carlton, EC Educator, Spooner School District

Some young children require a great deal of assistance to overcome difficulties they experience in taking and responding to information from their senses, and to achieve the levels of self-regulation they need. Learn effective strategies that help adults better understand sensory processing in infants and young children and how to help children interact more successfully with their environment.

5. Nutrition Education in the Curriculum

Monday, 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm

Presenter: Cora Ayers, Registered Certified Dietician, CLC

The need, importance, and application of integrating nutrition education into the existing preschool curriculum will be discussed in this presentation. The presenter demonstrates how, through integration of the nutrition education into the existing preschool curriculum areas, children can enrich their experiences in language, literacy, mathematics, science, creative arts, physical health, and social and emotional development. A CD and book of curriculum materials will be provided to session participants. Other nutrition education materials will be on display.

6. Shaken Baby Syndrome

A. Shaken Baby Syndrome Train the Trainers (6:00 pm - 9:00 pm)

Presenters: Alana Ahrens, CACFP, Western Dairyland and Tammy Tiltonson, River Source Family Resource Center

This is a double session that will certify you as a trainer for Shaken Baby Syndrome. We will work through the material and then perform an actual Shaken Baby Syndrome training. Presenters are certified train the trainers by Wisconsin's Children's Trust Fund.

B. Shaken Baby Syndrome Training (7:30 pm - 9:00 pm)

This training will meet the child care provider requirements of the April 2007 legislation.

7. The Peculiar Professor!

Welcome to the Little Learners Laboratory where the Peculiar Professor is busy testing theories, concocting wild and silly experiments, and discovering new and exciting things every day. 8. Improve Your ECERS Hand washing Scores

Monday, 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm

Presenters: Jeannie Jinkens, Head Start Teacher, CESA 11

Participants will participate in the "Wash Your Hands, Make Lots of Bubbles" curriculum to teach preschoolers how and when to wash their hands. Preschoolers will improve at-home hand washing and teachers will be provided classroom hand washing resources.

9. Partners in Supporting IEP and IFSPs in Childcare Environments

Monday, 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm

Presenters: Penny Holzwarth, Early Head Start Family Partner, CESA 11 and Kathy Boisvert, Western Region Community Collaboration Coach and Birth to 3 RESource Facilitator

As we work more collaboratively in early childhood settings and "sharing" children, we are also sharing responsibilities. Sometimes it feels overwhelming and beyond our area of comfort or expertise. In this session we will use

examples of Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSP) and Individual Education Plans (IEP) and breakdown the mystery of the plan into practical terms.

10. The Affect of Poverty on the Children We Teach

Tuesday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm

Presenters: Julie Keown-Bomar, Family Living and Nancy Coffey, Nutrition Coordinator, UWEX-Eau Claire County

What is poverty? How can you, as a preschool teacher, help the low income children you teach be successful? Teachers will gain insights into the pressures faced by low income families in meeting basic needs. Teachers will also identify one or two way(s) they, or the school or child care center where they are employed, can assist low income students and their families. 11. Great Books for Infants and Toddlers

12. Reflective Supervision

Just as teachers and staff working directly with young children need and deserve support, so do their directors and supervisors. Reflective supervision is both a "tool" and an approach within the broader scope of reflective practices. We will explore the core principles that guide the reflective supervisor approach and how to use these ideas in supervision and guidance.

13. Early Literacy and the Great Books

Presenters: Mary Joslin, EC Program Support, CESA 10 and Marianne Daw, ECSE Teacher, Augusta School District

This session will address the components of early literacy and why and how to make literacy come alive for children. Participants will look at books for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. You will plan and share short phonemic or phonological awareness activities that are easy to do every day with the children you work with. Resources will be provided.

14. Great Books for Preschoolers

Wednesday, 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm

Presenter: Marianne Daw, ECSE Teacher, Augusta School District

This session will focus on great books to use with children from ages three through six. You will get to listen to and experience some of the very best books for preschoolers. A list of the books shared will be provided along with a chance to share one of your favorites.
